## 1.0 Executive summary

Following anecdotal evidence that traditional crafts were not recognised at local government level, instead slipping between heritage (buildings) and the arts, the Heritage Crafts Association (HCA) conducted a survey into the support local councils (at city, district and county level) in England give to heritage/traditional crafts in their areas. The survey was conducted by volunteers and members of the HCA, by telephone, between November 2010 and March 2011. Two main questions were asked: 1) is there anybody within the council with a remit for traditional crafts, and 2) are there any council-led (or other) initiatives to promote and protect traditional crafts? The survey was also used as an opportunity to raise awareness of the HCA and to gain contacts within councils.

354 councils were contacted, of which 241 responded, giving a response rate of 68%. Of those 241 councils, only 42 (17.42%) have an officer whose remit includes traditional crafts - 11.86% of councils overall. Just over half of these officers (52.38%) are involved in the arts in some way, with culture also being prominent. However, 134 councils are involved in some sort of activity to support traditional crafts - 55.60% of responding councils, and 37.85% of councils overall. Quite strong regional differences can be observed in these figures.

The survey also produced valuable qualitative data. It became clear that, in many councils, there is a lack of understanding of what is meant by traditional crafts. Work with traditional crafts often happens quite informally and on an ad hoc basis. Councils often associate crafts with arts development services, but many councils are losing this service as arts are not statutory. Furthermore, within the arts context it is common to prioritise the innovative over the traditional. There is also a lack of cohesive strategy between district and county level councils with, in several cases, each thinking the responsibility for traditional crafts falls to the other.

This report concludes that local council support in England for traditional crafts is by no means universal and leaves a lot to be desired. While some councils are doing good work and others have schemes which could be expanded to benefit craftspeople, this report concludes that councils could do much more to recognise this valuable part of their local cultural heritage and to support and promote traditional crafts across the full range of their services.

There is support for heritage crafts at national government level and John Hayes, the Minister for Skills, has publicly given his support for heritage crafts. This support needs to be extended to local government. This report recommends that the HCA continues to raise awareness of traditional crafts and their needs within local government. The results of this survey should be used to produce guidelines and give advice on how councils can support traditional crafts in their areas. It is also recommended that local councils work together on a county and regional level to develop a strategy for supporting traditional crafts to ensure that they do not slip through the net.

## 2.0 Context of survey

The Heritage Crafts Association (HCA) is the advocacy body for traditional heritage crafts in the UK. Working in partnership with Government and key agencies, it provides a focus for craftspeople, groups, societies and guilds, as well as individuals who care about the loss of traditional crafts skills, and works towards a healthy and sustainable framework for the future.

Research is one of the five key ways in which the HCA supports and promotes heritage crafts as a fundamental part of our living heritage. The HCA's latest research, a survey into the support local councils offer to heritage/traditional<sup>1</sup> crafts in their areas, was carried out between November 2010 and March 2011 - just before large cuts to public spending and local government funding were announced by the Coalition Government. Thus, the picture presented by this survey may change considerably in the following months.

## 3.0 Purpose of survey

The HCA conducted a survey, by telephone, across all of the local councils (at city, district and county level) in England<sup>2</sup> to ascertain whether local councils offer any support towards traditional crafts in their areas, and if anybody within the council has responsibility for them. The survey was also used as an opportunity to raise awareness of the HCA within local government, and to gain contacts within councils.

## 4.0 Survey questions

The survey consisted of two main questions:

1. Is there anyone within the council whose remit includes traditional crafts?  
[If so, name, job title, and contact details were taken]
2. Are you aware of any council-led (or other) initiatives to promote and protect these crafts, especially those of local significance?  
[If yes, please describe]

These questions were intentionally open-ended, rather than multiple choice, to allow for the structural differences of local governments, and to enable the HCA to build up the broadest picture of the work local councils do with traditional crafts.

Respondents were then asked two further questions:

3. Can we add your details to the HCA mailing list?  
[Name, job title and contact details recorded]
4. Should we undertake further research, would you be willing to complete a survey for us? Do you prefer online or by telephone?

## 5.0 Definitions

The following definitions were given, verbally, during the survey.

### 5.1 Heritage/traditional crafts

Heritage/traditional crafts are crafts in which new things are made using traditional materials and techniques, as opposed to conserving existing objects. They include anything from basketmaking to ironmongery, to wood-turning to weaving, and also to traditional crafts from other cultural communities living within an area.<sup>3</sup>

It was also highlighted that the HCA is primarily concerned with ‘portable’ crafts rather than building crafts.

### 5.2 Support for heritage/traditional crafts

Support for traditional crafts could be anything from keeping a database of traditional craft practitioners in the area, providing business support to craft practitioners, holding events and exhibitions, incorporating traditional crafts into the local heritage or tourism package etc.

## 6.0 Method

The HCA survey took place between November 2010 and March 2011, although results continued to come in by email during April 2011.<sup>4</sup> 354 councils were contacted.

The list of councils to be contacted was taken from the local councils page of the Directgov website,<sup>5</sup> which also provides contact details for every local council in the UK. This list includes councils at city, district and county levels. Although the HCA works for traditional crafts across the UK, it was decided that, initially, only councils in England would be contacted.

The survey was conducted county by county, region by region. An initial questionnaire was drawn up and trialled in Cambridgeshire (see **Appendix 1**) but the level of response indicated that the questions were too specific; the questions were then revised (see **Section 4.0**). This trial also gave an indication of how effective and time-consuming the survey would be. After trialling these new questions across the East of England with better success, the survey was extended to the rest of England.

The survey was conducted by members of the HCA and volunteers recruited for the purpose. Telephone was the prime method of surveying. Interviewers took as detailed notes as possible during the survey, but it was not possible to record responses verbatim. Each council was telephoned, and this was followed up with email if required. To maximise efficiency, it was suggested that if there was no response interviewers should leave one message followed by an email if they did not hear back; and then to leave it at that. Telephoning was chosen above online or paper questionnaires because of the anticipated higher response rate, and the increased chance of the survey reaching the most appropriate respondent within each council. However, the survey was quite-time intensive, with calls taking approximately five minutes each and with interviewers frequently being passed from department to department.

The HCA is aware of the limitations of this survey, but believe it is useful in producing a good picture of the work that local councils in England are currently doing to support traditional crafts.

## 7.0 Presentation and discussion of findings

The findings are based solely on the information provided during the survey, even if councils were subsequently found to be doing other work to support traditional crafts, and it is also possible that the people interviewed were not fully informed about all the activities councils are involved in.

### 7.1 Response rate

354 councils in England at city, district and county level were contacted, of which 241 responded - giving a response rate of 68%. This is very high, and is due to the survey being conducted by telephone.

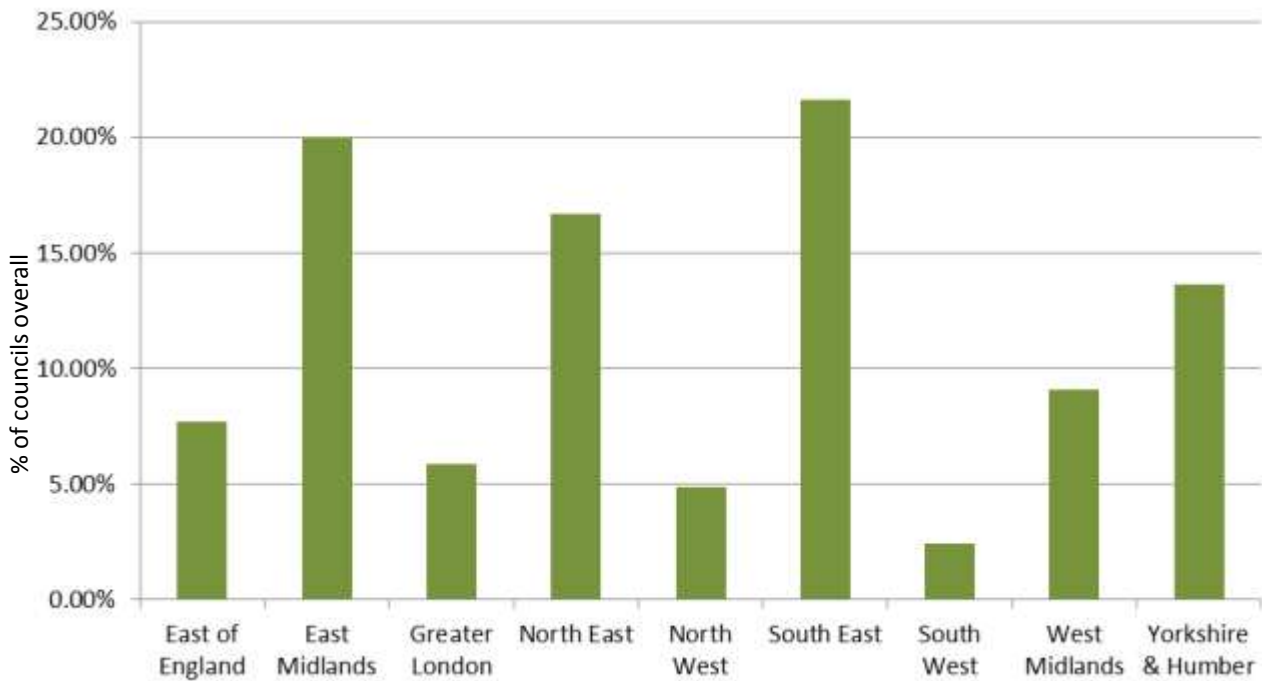

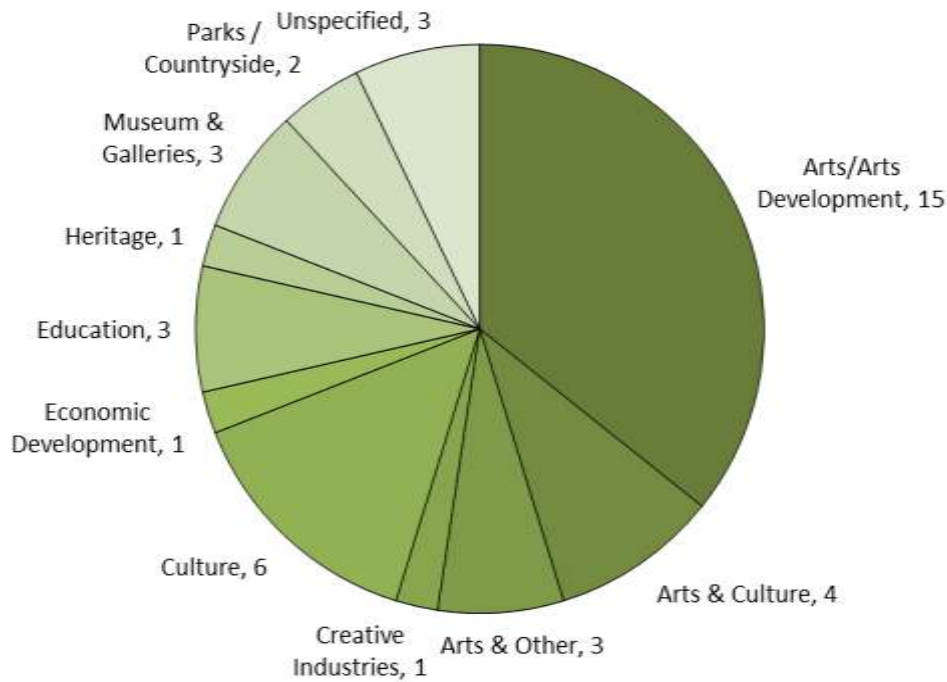
**Chart 1:** Percentage of councils overall with a remit for traditional crafts, by region

Of the 241 councils which responded, 42 (17.42%) have an officer whose remit includes traditional crafts. This is only 11.86% of the 354 councils in England. This figure includes councils which expressly stated they had an officer with such a remit, and councils in which an officer acknowledged that traditional crafts would be covered by their department, even if they did not actually undertake any work with traditional crafts. At nearly twice the average for England, the East of England and the South East have the most councils with remits which cover traditional crafts, while the South West has the least.

### 7.3 Departments which work with traditional crafts

It quickly became apparent the structure of councils varies greatly, and thus it is difficult to categorically state which department is most likely to work with traditional crafts. This is complicated by the fact that many councils are merging, cutting or outsourcing various departments and services. The majority of the officers whose remit includes traditional crafts are involved in arts and arts development, with culture the next most common.

There was also a tendency for councils which did not have a remit for traditional crafts to associate crafts with arts and arts development, and 15 councils (see **Appendix 2**) mentioned that they did not have, had just lost or were about to lose their arts development position. Other councils (see **Appendix 2**) identified that supporting traditional crafts would fall under the remit of several officers and departments across the council.

#### **Case Study: Elmbridge Borough Council**

The post of Arts Development Officer was originally withdrawn from Elmbridge Borough Council in 2010 when the previous officer retired, as part of the current cost-saving. However, residents made an outcry and the Council reinstated the post part-time. Although this means that there is not as much time to develop and support all the projects he would like to, the Officer has ‘been given a bit of blank canvas.’

At present, the Council involves local artists and gives them space and opportunities to market their products and skills at any festivals and events, gives grants to local studios, and supports Surrey Artists Open Studios. Elmbridge Council has a positive attitude, and is aware that it there is much more it could do.

## 7.4 Council activities

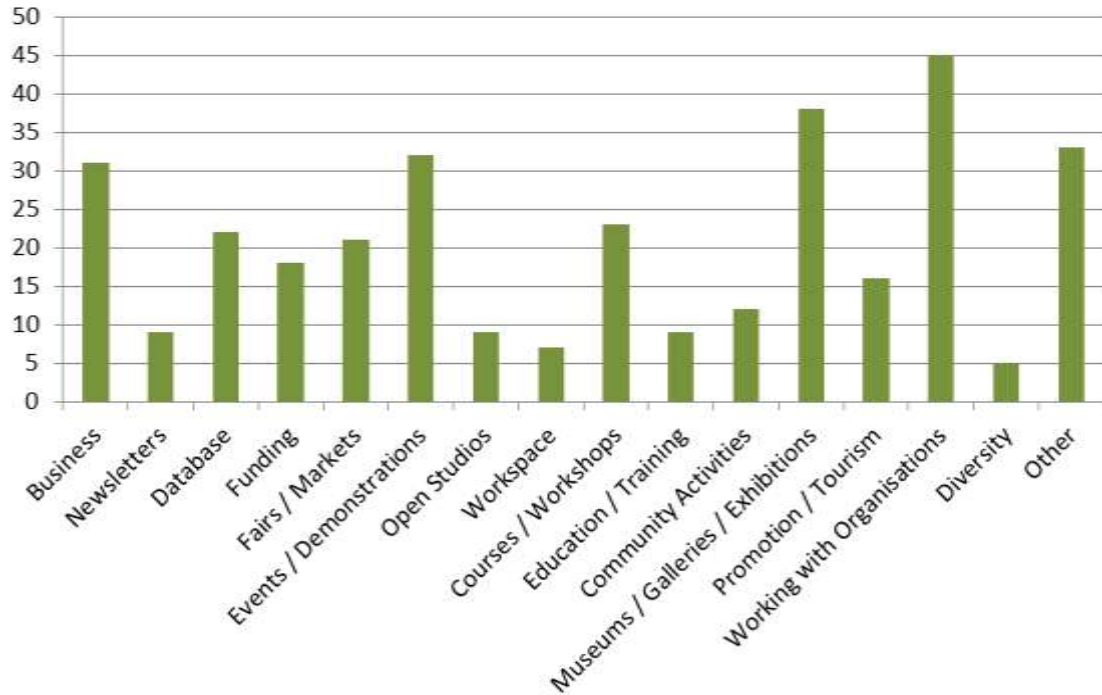
Although only 42 councils have a remit which includes traditional crafts, many more councils are involved in activities to support traditional crafts. In total, 134 councils (55.60% of responding councils; 37.85% of councils overall) are involved in some sort of activity, ranging from supporting craftspeople as businesses, to incorporating craft into education, training and lifelong learning, to promoting craft as a cultural resource. Other councils mentioned that they would like to do something but did not have the money, and highlighted that arts is not a statutory service.

From the descriptions councils gave of the work they are doing to support traditional crafts, 16 categories were identified (including an 'Other' category). 'Working with other organisations' was most common - this ranged from working with local craft organisations to working with organisations to which the councils' arts or culture services had been sub-contracted. Many councils said that they would offer craft practitioners business advice in the same way that they would offer it to any other small business. 7 councils (see **Appendix 2**) provide workspace for craftspeople, often at low rents. The 'Other' category included involving crafts in regeneration programmes (Waveney District Council), commissioning work (Mole Valley District Council and Canterbury City Council), conducting an audit of local heritage activity (Wirral Metropolitan Borough Council) and taking action in the Council's corporate change plans to work to support traditional crafts and industries (Winchester City Council).

Furthermore, there were several councils who, although they did not do anything to support traditional crafts, did do work to support contemporary crafts in their areas.

#### Case Study: Wolverhampton City Council

The Council supports traditional craft through adult education and specifically includes what it describes as ‘dying craft’ in its adult education service. These crafts include spinning, weaving, dress-making, woodcarving and embroidery. However, the Council mentioned that it has experienced problems in getting funding to teach courses which do not have qualifications.

## 7.5 Other trends

It was also possible to identify other trends from the data.

### 7.5.1 Switchboard issues

The first point of contact within each council was the switchboard - each interviewer had to ask the switchboard operator to be transferred to someone who might deal with traditional crafts. In many cases, the interviewer was asked which department this might be, or was asked to wait while the switchboard operator searched for the word 'craft' in their directory. This raises the possibility that councils might be doing work with traditional crafts in an informal capacity but, because this work is not listed, the switchboard is not aware of it and is not able to pass accurate information to anyone making enquiries. It is recommended that councils list crafts in their directories, and ensure that their switchboard operators are aware of the work that they are doing in this capacity, so that any future enquiries can be answered accurately.

#### Case Study: Switchboard comments

“Good question - I bet you've had that response from a few!” (Bristol City Council)

“I don't have the foggiest idea” (Purbeck District Council)

“Never had an enquiry like that before” (Isle of Wight Council)

“No idea! Wouldn't know who” (Telford and Wrekin Council)

“..... [met with friendly laughter]” (Welwyn Hatfield Borough Council)

### 7.5.2 Lack of understanding about traditional crafts

A lack of awareness and understanding of traditional crafts quickly became apparent during the survey - among switchboard operators and among officers. Interviewers found that they were often asked to explain what traditional crafts were, and asked to give examples. This lack of understanding could also be seen in the departments to which interviewers were transferred - examples include conservation, building, planning and regeneration. Hopefully, the survey will have raised awareness of traditional crafts within councils, and it is organisations like the HCA that can promote general understanding of traditional crafts and the issues they face.

### 7.5.3 County and district level councils

While the majority of councils said that there was no officer whose remit would include traditional crafts, a trend emerged in which district level councils said that

traditional crafts would be covered at county level; for the county councils to then say they would be covered at district level. Councils within each county and region need to clarify who is doing what to ensure that traditional crafts do not slip through the net in this way.

#### 7.5.4 Enabling councils

Another trend was for councils to identify themselves as ‘strategic’ or ‘enabling’ councils - that is, councils which do not actively work with traditional crafts, but might do something if they were approached by an organisation or individual in the area (see **Appendix 2**). This may well be a result of the small budgets that local councils have. Efforts need to be taken to raise awareness of this amongst craftspeople in these areas so that they are able to benefit from the work of such councils.

#### 7.6 Good examples

Some examples have been chosen to highlight the wide range of ways in which local councils can support traditional crafts.

##### **Case Study: Winchester City Council**

Working with traditional crafts is part of several officers’ work at Winchester City Council. In Arts Development, craft makers are supported in the same way as arts practitioners, with professional networks, workspace provision (where possible) and exhibition space in the form of open studios and markets. The museums team has run several exhibitions featuring heritage crafts. There are even actions in the Council’s Corporate Change Plans to work to support traditional crafts and industries, both portable and non-portable.

Applicants from heritage craft backgrounds have received grant funding for rural business and communities, and a wide variety of grants are available to heritage crafts from the Rural Development Programme for England across Winchester and East Hampshire. Local craft industries are promoted to visitors as part of the tourism package, and the Council runs an open studios scheme each year. Winchester’s Culturenet organisation promotes understanding of black and minority ethnic communities, including the demonstration and celebration of traditional crafts.

### **Case Study: Epping Forest District Council**

Epping Forest District Council does not have a policy regarding traditional crafts. However, the museum and countryside management team are planning [accurate in November 2010] a project around traditional crafts, with both heritage and contemporary elements. The project aims to work with craftspeople to interpret the historic craft items in the museums' collections, to interview and record craftspeople working in the district to create a contemporary record, and to create a directory of local craftspeople. It is also hoped that the whole project will be put online. Alongside all of this, the project's organisers hope to encourage people to learn about traditional land management techniques, complementing the project with a 'live in the landscape' element. It remains to be seen whether this project will have the funding to go forward.

### **Case Study: Canterbury City Council**

Canterbury City Council promotes cultural practice 'across the board'. The Council is very supportive of its local cultural scene and is trying to increase the work it does to support it. In terms of arts and crafts the emphasis is on locally-produced work, rather than on traditional or contemporary.

The Council's museums service deals with the preservation side of crafts. Artists and craftspeople can join the arts and craft market and exhibit in the gallery. The Council has a database of all artists in the area, and promotes events through the database. While generally waiting to be approached by artists and craftspeople, the Council does encourage incentivised initiatives through its TAP scheme of funding, which includes commissioning work for public spaces and grants for research and development. The Economic Development team aims to give as much business advice as possible through Business Link, and tries to get all artists and makers to think of themselves as businesses. They run business workshops and conduct annual surveys to find out what artists and craftspeople need - be it funding, support or business advice.

### **Case Study: Medway Council**

The Arts Development team supports arts, crafts and performing arts and the Council works closely with partners and its local artist community. The Council funds Rochester Art Gallery and Craft Case, although these tend to focus on contemporary art and craft. However, Craft Case enables makers to exhibit and sell their work, supports free maker-led workshops and talks, and also provides professional development support and mentoring for artists and makers. There are also several venues across Medway which sell and promote traditional and contemporary crafts. Heritage crafts, including a ropery, carpenters, furniture makers and blacksmiths can be found at the Historic Dockyard in Chatham, alongside the creative industries. The Outreach and Education Officer delivers arts and craft activities, workshops and projects in rural and urban, non-traditional arts venues and the Council runs adult education courses in crafts such as pottery.

Medway Council is keen to build on its existing provision to develop makers and engage a sustainable craft audience. One plan is to hold a 'high quality craft fair, blending the traditional and contemporary. It is hoped that the fair will offer a wider platform for makers and craftspeople in Kent and the South East to explore and celebrate their skills and knowledge, to provide a focus for keeping these skills alive, to generate interest from those wanting to learn these skills and become professional makers/craftsmen, and also to support a buying audience and collectors.

## 8.0 Summary of findings

- 241 out of 354 city, district and county level councils in England responded to the survey.
- Of those 241 councils, 42 (17.42%) have an officer whose remit includes traditional crafts - 11.86% of councils overall.
- By region, East Midlands, North East and South East are most likely to have an officer whose remit includes traditional crafts, and Greater London, North West and South West are least likely.
- Just over half of these officers (52.38%) are involved in the arts in some way, with culture also being prominent. Other departments include economic development, education, heritage, museums and galleries, and parks and countryside.
- Many councils associate traditional crafts with arts development, but 15 councils do not have, have lost or are about to lose their arts service.
- 134 councils are involved in some sort of activity to support traditional crafts - 55.60% of the councils that responded, and 37.85% of councils overall. In this respect, the South East is leading the way with nearly half of all councils involved in some sort of activity, while the West Midlands is falling behind.
- The main way in which local councils are supporting traditional crafts is by working with other organisations.
- There is a lack of understanding in councils of what traditional crafts are.
- Traditional crafts often slip through the county and district level divide.

## 9.0 Conclusions

Only a small proportion of councils are doing anything to support traditional crafts in their areas, while an even tinier proportion have an officer who is responsible for traditional crafts. Many more councils could do much more to support traditional crafts across the full range of their services. This does not mean having an officer whose sole responsibility is traditional crafts, which would be unfeasible, but an officer who works with traditional crafts as part of their remit. Overlooking this valuable part of local cultural heritage is a lost opportunity. However, there are some councils which are doing extremely good work and support crafts across the full range of council services - from business, to arts, to tourism, to heritage, to education - and ultimately, this is what all councils should be striving for.

## 10.0 Recommendations

- Raise awareness of traditional crafts in local councils, and across all departments. This includes awareness of what traditional crafts are, the issues they face, and ways of responding to those issues. The HCA is in a prime

position to do this, and raising awareness and raising the status of heritage craft skills with the wider public is one of its five key activities.

- The results from this survey should be used to produce guidelines and give advice on how councils can support traditional crafts in their areas.
- This report should be disseminated to all the local councils in England, with examples of best practice highlighted.
- Councils should publicise any work they are doing with traditional crafts so that craftspeople know if something is happening in their areas. They should also ensure that any work they are doing is listed in their directories and on their websites, so that accurate information is available to anyone making enquiries.
- On a county level, all councils should work together to develop a strategy for supporting traditional crafts to ensure that they are not slipping through the net. This could also be done on a regional level.
- Councils should ensure that there is understanding of what an enabling council is, and efforts need to be taken to raise awareness of this amongst craftspeople in those areas so that they feel they are able to approach to the councils for support.

## 11.0 Future research

The survey could be extended to Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland to provide a complete picture of the support local councils give to traditional crafts across the UK. This would allow for analysis across the four countries and might provide some successful models, such as in Scotland (where the UNESCO Convention for the Safeguarding of the Intangible Cultural Heritage is recognised) from which councils across the country could learn. This could then be used to develop a more complete strategy for local government protection of heritage crafts in the UK.

Another avenue for further research would be to repeat the survey in a year or two, using the contacts provided in this survey, to see how traditional crafts have fared in the local government agenda as a result of cuts to local authority funding.
